

Featured Member: Kipp Shipley, DNP, ACNP-BC



Kipp Shipley, DNP, ACNP-BC began his career in healthcare as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) in Knoxville, Tennessee, and went on to graduate as a Registered Nurse from the University of Tennessee. He began his nursing career in Open Heart Recovery in Louisville, Kentucky, and later transitioned to the Surgical Intensive Care Unit at Rush University Medical Center in Chicago, Illinois. While at Rush University, he obtained a Doctor of Nursing Practice with a research focus in inhospital resuscitation quality. As a new nurse practitioner Kipp joined the Medical Intensive Care Unit at Vanderbilt University Medical Center and assisted in staffing the dedicated covid unit during the Covid-19 Pandemic. In 2021 Kipp joined the Critical Care Outreach Team (CCOT) at Vanderbilt and is now the Team Lead for CCOT. He has presented at regional, national, and international

conferences on resuscitation quality and data collection, and is a co-author on the Society of Critical Care Medicine's Guidelines for Recognizing Deterioration Outside of the Intensive Care Unit.

What areas are you interested in?

"My specific areas of research are clinical deterioration, in-hospital cardiac arrest (IHCA), and resuscitation quality. I try to focus on the systems involved in these areas, and how we can improve recognition of clinical deterioration to prevent progression to cardiac arrest. When I began work in this area at VUMC there were large data gaps, so over the past few years I've worked to establish baseline data to serve as the baseline data for future quality work in these areas."

What are you working on?

"This year I've focused on ways we can migrate our redcap data collection tools into more accessible workflows. This began with REDCap data flowing into tableau dashboards, and we're currently exploring ways for this data to live directly in the EHR. We've built quite a robust database of clinical deterioration events, but my hope is to migrate them directly to the EHR so we can facilitate better analysis of this patient population."

What would you like to collaborate with others on?

"I have a few ideas that might be great for collaboration. First, we still do not have an accurate, easily accessible early warning score in our practice at VUMC. There are *many* different scores, but the conversation easily gets bogged down into which is best. My focus is getting a baseline system in place and then improving it over time. I'd also like to collaborate with others on a better solution than the current Code Narrator in Epic. I think it works for some areas, but there are opportunities to improve the narrator in ways that would be more accessible for staff.
